The Ditidaht First Nation is pleased to offer a fixed term, full time employment opportunity for a **Secondary Teacher** with the Ditidaht Community School from August 29th, 2023 - June 28th, 2024.

The Ditidaht Community School is located on the traditional territory of the Ditidaht First Nation at Nitinaht Lake: a semi-remote community accessible by logging roads, one and a half hours by gravel road from Port Alberni and one hour by gravel road from Lake Cowichan on beautiful Vancouver Island.

Ditidaht Community School offers Elementary and Secondary Education, with a vision of weaving together traditional and current educational practices, to provide our children with the skills and abilities for any future of their choosing. To support this vision Ditidaht First Nation is one of seven BC nations that will have Jurisdiction over its on-reserve education as of July 1, 2023.

There are 54 students registered at Ditidaht Community School in Kindergarten - Grade 12.

Ditidaht First Nation offers teacher wages comparable to the local school districts, a benefits package, and subsidized housing.

ABOUT THE DITIDAHT FIRST NATION

Ditidaht's unceded traditional territory is quite large. It stretches inland past Lake Cowichan and outlines Nitinaht Lake itself, including lands beyond the lake, and it extends to the coast, between Bonilla Point and Pachena Point. Ditidaht traditional territories also include important resources, such as underground water stores known as aquifers, tributary rivers and

steams, and significant ocean ranges that are utilized to provide the nation with halibut, cod and various salmon species. Ditidaht has a registered member population of 775 members, with 250 people living in the local community of Balaats'adt, more commonly known as Nitinaht Lake, B.C.

Current Ditidaht membership is comprised of at least 10 small villages that were along the coast within Ditidaht traditional territory. Significant villages or regions typically had a hereditary chief and traditional governance system, which was in place until colonialism reached the west coast. Ditidaht people speak a distinct dialect, closely related to neighbouring Nuu-Chah-Nulth nations.
