Quarterly Report

During the past three months my main focus has been directed towards the health aspect of my portfolios, both mental and physical. I have attended two gathering that were focused on youth mental health and FN youth in care. The main focus at the BC 1st Nations Children and Family Gathering was gathering of information on Children in care and ageing out. Many suggestions and case histories were presented. Action plans will be suggested from information gathered. There were representatives from Federal and Provincial Ministries that deal with children and families. A more positive response was gained from the Federal rep than the Provincial counterpart. A concerted effort to calls to action on the recommendations laid out in the reconciliation report in regards to child welfare was put forward. I also attended the NCN Health Caucus which covered the concerns of quality of care experienced by First Nation patients.
